

Brisket bones for Dogs



What actually is a brisket bone? (See picture on the left.) Where does it come from?! A brisket bone isn't a bone at all. It's cartilage and connects the two sides of the chest. So if you have a look at the picture you can see that it doesn't look very hard and it isn't. If you are concerned about your dog's teeth then it is a great alternative to big bones. The brisket bone is a fatty bone. Which turns it into a really bad snack for already overweight dogs. But if your

dog is extremely active – go for it! Up to 3 brisket bones a week is fine for adult dogs and smaller brisket bones - twice a week - with most of the fat removed for puppies. This is only a recommendation - be guided by your dog's weight and make a sensible decision.
