

#### Sydney Royal 2016 Judge – Mrs B Svarstad - Sweden



?

Birgitta has been involved with dogs most of her life. With her mother Elsa Edgren they bred Collie (Rough), Shetland Sheepdog and Bearded Collies under the prefix Bifrost between the years 1958 - 1973. They also had a top winning Shih Tzu, Pug and Miniature Poodles. They also bred a few Lhasa Apso champions. In total they bred around 100 champions in these breeds.

In 1972 The Swedish Kennel Club awarded them the Hamiltonplaketten, a most prestigious prize for breeding top class dogs. After her marriage to Per in 1973 they took the prefix Moorwood and now only breed Shetland Sheepdogs. They have now bred 99 champions under this prefix including 33 international champions.

They have also bred 3 World winners and 2 Junior World winners. Per & Birgitta were the first foreign breeder to have bred a none English born Sheltie to become a GB Ch. Moorwood is well known in many pedigrees around the world. They have also imported shelties from Australia, New Zealand, Canada and England. Most of them are titled and have strongly contributed to the standard of the Shetland Sheepdog.

In 1964 Birgitta started to judge in open shows, founded the Swedish Shetland Sheepdog Club in 1967 and in 1976 she was authorized as a judge by the Swedish Kennel Club in her first breeds, collies, shelties and bearded collies. Today she is licensed to judge in all FCI groups apart from 4. Birgitta has judged specialty shows and BIS in many parts of the world.



# <u>Good Friday Judge</u> <u>Mrs Dianna Spavin – United Kingdom</u>

Dianna Spavin was born into the world of dogs, Her mother Marion Spavin started the world famous Dialynne Beagle kennels in 1958. Dianna together with her daughter Melanie the 3<sup>rd</sup> generation have produced over 100 champions in Beagles, Cockers, Min Schnauzers Tibetan Terriers and Australian Shepherds . The Tibetan Terrier Ch Araki Tinkle Winkle of Dialynne became the youngest Ch ever in the breed at the age of 12 months and 13 days.

In 2010 their Beagle and Aussie were top winning dogs in their breeds. Dianna has had a varied life working mostly with animals. At the age of 16 she started work with guard dogs, then at a riding school and from there went on to work in hunt stables. She came home and started her own successful grooming parlour which she ran for 25 years. In 1989 the family moved to Solihull buying the late Ron Bradbury's Boarding Kennels.

Dianna started judging in the early 1970's and now awards CC's in 46 breeds. She judges the Hound, Toy, Pastoral and Utility Groups and judged her first Best in Show at Bath Ch Show in 2009.

Dianna handed over the reins to Melanie when her judging career took off but still handles when needed.

## <u>Easter Sunday Judge</u> <u>Mr Raymond Yurick</u> – Canada



I basically grew up in the sport of pure bred dogs starting off as a junior handler, showing mostly Afghans and Whippets. So my love of hounds began early on, my first personal dog being an Afghan.

When I finished high school, I pursued my passion for showing dogs by working as an assistant for respected Top Canadian Handlers in Eastern Ontario. After many years of their tutelage I set off on my own professional handling career, with great success. While an assistant I was reintroduced to Whippets and I am proud to have loved, been owned by, and exhibited many treasures for over 25 years. Needless to say a passion was born.

As a Professional Handler on both sides of the border, I showed All Breeds, but did find over time I was specializing in Hounds. I am proud to boast before retiring to start judging, that I had won Best in Shows with breeds in all 7 groups.

The top highlights of my handling career came on the other end of the lead of Am/Can Ch Brushwood's Moxi of Endeavour. Canada's Top Winning Whippet (Best in Show record and point record) Canadian national specialty winner in 2003 as a puppy.

But our American and AWC National adventures together are some of my favourite memories. Our First AKC BIS, AWC Winners Bitch on to Best of Breed in 2004,AWC BOS in 2005 and the greatest honour of winning the 2005 TOP 20 judged by our peers

3 times AWC National Specialty winner is an achievement we will always cherish. As a handler she was a dream come true, as her co breeder and friend, she is a gift I will never forget

I have been judging for 4 years now in North America , Hounds and Sporting breeds Highlights include, National Whippet Club of Canada 2015, AWC Top 20 2015, cascade hound specialty (US), Foothills Gazehound specialty (Can), NWCC regional Specialty and Several AWC supported entries. I am also about to judge the Canadian Whippet National (which I am so excited about!) and I won the vote to judge the 2016 AWC southern regional in Atlanta.

I have been very fortunate to make acquaintances with some great Whippet people and I have had the pleasure of co breeding some very wonderful whippets under the Brushwood and Bretica prefix including AWC and NWCC National winners, Canadian and US BIS winners, numerous champions and even more healthy well loved pets. I pride myself on being a constant and conscientious student of the breed.

#### Rescue Report

Following is a roll call of Rescues and Rehomes from 2015.

Brutus (now Teddy), Oscar, Paris, Peso and Storm, Nikko, Finn, Daisy, Bella, Smokey and Snowey, Max and Jasper, Cleo and Pharaoh, Ben and Molly, Scout

The majority have settled into their new homes well, and taken over the lounge as only a Whippet can. Finn with his separation anxiety issues took a little longer, but happy to report things are looking good now.

Still looking for a new home are 5 year olds Max and Jasper. These boys didn't receive adequate socialising as youngsters and will require a person who is willing to put in some work. They are staying with their current owner until a suitable new home can be found.

As each rescue or rehome finds its new home a brief update is recorded on the Club website. If you know of anyone looking for a rescue please direct them to the Club website, specifically the Rescue Rehome page.

There were some notable dogs throughout the year; first to come to mind is Oscar, a little male aged 14 months that had no relationship with people whatsoever. Oscar stayed just out of your reach and all contact had to be initiated by him after he trusted you; that took a while. When I met him at a rest-stop for handover up the central coast I was thankful he was on a well fitted collar and lead because it was very clear he wanted to bolt.

The Ranger told me she had to "crash tackle" Oscar so that she could capture him. His owners were no help as he wouldn't come near them either. He had spent his young life chained up. As my fences are not adequate enough for a dog like Oscar he went to Christine Kirkman for fostering. Fortunately though one thing Oscar does have is great dog skills and took his lead from Christine's Whippets and Ridgebacks. For quite some time I didn't think I would ever find him a suitable home. Eventually though a lovely lady contacted us who was willing to let Oscar take whatever time he needed to come around to human attention. It helped that Eve had a friendly and well adjusted dog at home, good fences but most of all time and patience.

Then there was Cleo and Pharaoh, two seniors who came to us via Greyhound Rescue. Cleo had a severe case of canine cough that nobody was aware of until the next morning having arrived at the Greyhound Rescue kennel facility quite late and in the dark. I felt awful as the entire block had to be cleaned and disinfected from top to bottom; as if they didn't have enough to do. They supplied our foster carer with food and a huge Greyhound coat for little Pharaoh which made him look like a little old man, but he was warm. (I mailed a Whippet coat).

Due to the canine cough I wanted a foster carer who had no dogs. As luck would have it I had been contacted by Katie just a few weeks earlier who said she would love to foster Whippets, having fallen in love with a Whippet at the horse racing stables where she worked - perfect. For 6 weeks Katie and her flatmate fostered Cleo and Pharaoh, nursing Cleo back to health with some tough moments and plenty of phone calls regarding Cleo's health. They were filthy and smothered in fleas. Pharaoh, weighing only 9kgs, needed a special wash to relieve and cure his red and infected skin and needed to be brought back into good condition. After a few days rest his appetite kicked in and there was no stopping him.

Unfortunately when Katie needed to go to Queensland for 2 weeks to visit family, Cleo started to jump the gate. Her flat mate called me and it was arranged for Cleo and Pharaoh to be passed over to Kristine Ruhle who goes above and beyond to help our broken hounds. Two weeks later they were finally well enough to be rehomed and are now living with Barri and Carol in the Blue Mountains. Barri has been involved in JRT all his life but is now a Whippet convert.

As always many thanks to foster carers Christine Kirkman, Kristine Ruhle, Gen Power, K T Barr and flatmates, you're all awesome and Lisa B and Toni C who listened to me when I needed to "bounce ideas around".

If you would like to assist our rescues there is always need for pre-loved but sturdy hound collars and Whippet coats, worming tablets etc. Thank you to those that have already made donations.

Please support our Rescue Raffle "sack full of hounds" at the 2016 NSW Specialty. Specifically crafted and donated by Terry Thomas to raise funds for rescue. They are all one of a kind individually sculpted from Polymer clay. Thank you Terry.


