<u>Rescue Report</u>

Sadly rescue continues to be busy and looking back thru my records it averages out to one Whippet per month that requires our help.....dogs, bitches, pairs, siblings, young and old, there doesnt seem to be a pattern.

About half are fostered; by myself when possible but mostly by Kristine Ruhle and her wonderful family who are just the nicest people and just recently two more non-show Whippet enthusiasts have come on board and fostered - Gen Power from the Newcastle area and K T Barr from Sydney. Having "pet" people involved with fostering is great as most of us already have a full lounge LOL. Then there is Jack Oates (country NSW) who always puts her hand up and Denny and Tony who helped out in the ACT recently. Thank you for opening your homes to strange dogs and making the effort to re-train and assess them.

The club is often contacted by owners who for one reason or another can no longer keep or want the dog(s). In those instances wherever possible I will work with the owner to find a suitable new home direct or sometimes all they have needed is a bit of support and advice. All our rescues are advertised on the Club website or DOL Rescue Section.

In other instances I am alerted to Whippets in pounds and shelters and it's these Whippets which are generally fostered if they are not adopted directly by the public. I always alert anyone on the rescue waiting list to Whippets in pounds and shelters.

Sometimes we have absolutely no idea why anyone would want to surrender a "perfectly good Whippet", other times after a few weeks in foster care less desireable traits emerge, generally separation anxiety issues and it's then that extra careful selection of the dogs forever home is imperative. I keep in contact with our rescue families and am happy to say that to date we have been very successful with matching our rescues with their forever homes.

Only 2% of rescues have come from Registered Breeders and as always they have been rehomed with the full knowledge and support of their breeder. The remainder have no breeder support and it's sad to see that Whippets are becoming somewhat popular amongst back yard breeders. Most are neither microchipped or desexed.

Most days I receive emails and phone calls inquiring after rescue Whippets. Whenever there is not a rescue or a suitable rescue then I will direct them to our club members and the mature section of DOL. I have found that the average pet person has a poor understanding of what a retired or exshow dog is and what a fabulous family pet they could make.

Finally a very big thank you to those members who have contributed in some way or another with rescue, either transport, Whippet collars, coat, crates etc, food and most importantly support when I've needed to bounce ideas around. It's lovely to see that competition can be put aside when it comes to helping our chosen breed.

Here's hoping that the remainder of the year remains rescue free. Cheers, Kaz Rescue / Rehome Officer for The Whippet Club of NSW Inc

Hello my name is Daisy and I would like to give you an update on my newly found forever home.

However, before I do, I just wanted to thank Genevieve, Will, Devo and Pepper for providing me with the best foster home a girl could ask for: the love and companionship I received in their home no doubt set me up for being the well adjusted little rescue dog I am. I also want to than Kaz and the NSW Whippet Club for rescuing me and giving me a chance: I know it's not easy and that it is time consuming and costly but everyone in my new household believes it's worth it.

I arrived almost three weeks ago and the human I have adopted as my own was surprised that it really took less than two days for me to fit in. There are two other dogs in the household and while they are not whippets, they are very friendly and accommodating. They have also trained the human occupant rather well so I had very little work in that regard.

In the first few days I was confronted with a wide range of new experiences: ferry travel; water and tides (who knew a beach could disappear and reappear?); eating out at cafes; and meeting a variety of new dogs and human neighbours. All of these things I calmly took in my stride so really to any outsider I looked like I'd been part of the pack forever. In fact, nothing, so far, has phased me. By day three I was a seafaring whippet boarding and disembarking ferries with no care at all.



Each day I go for zoomies on the beach and at the park and much my favourite activity is having someone chase me – though I have yet to find anyone who comes close even when I'm only in second gear...Rosey and Lily have taught me about the water but it is still a little cold and while I accidently got into water that came above my belly, I'm not sure about this swimming activity that Rosey takes pleasure in..

I was identified as a bit of a wanderer and Houdini but this hasn't been an issue at my new home as there are no fences to scale and I bonded almost immediately with the other canines in the household. ANKC LURE COURSING IN NEW SOUTH WALES

2015 saw the commencement of ANKC Lure Coursing in New South Wales. After two mock trials to allow coursers and officials to learn the ropes, the first official trial was held in July.

Whippets attended each event and trial held in NSW this year.

What is Lure Coursing?

The purpose of lure coursing events is to preserve and develop the coursing skills inherent in sighthounds and to demonstrate their ability to perform the function for which they were originally bred. Lure coursing is an artificial simulation of the way a hare might run in an open field, with the course pattern being irregular and varied with every meet.

In lure coursing, dogs chase an artificial lure across a field, following a pattern that is meant to simulate the movement of a hare. The lure is strips of plastic bags tied to a nylon cord which is pulled around on pulleys by a motor. A typical lure course is between 650 metres to 800 or 900 metres long; however course lengths can vary dependent on field conditions on the day.

The course must have a minimum number of turns in order to simulate prey e.g. hunting down a hare that changes direction in a chase. If a dog is lure focused they will typically follow the lure from start to finish and not run off course. Sighthounds generally have no need to be trained or enticed to chase the lure since the desire to chase is instinctual. However some dogs may require lure play at a very early age to encourage them to follow an artificial lure with enthusiasm or to build confidence for the chase.

Anyone wishing to participate in lure coursing should ensure their dog is extremely fit before attending an event. Lure coursing is a physically demanding sport and it's important that each dog is in peak health to be able to cope with the physical stress on their bodies.

For the purposes for ANKC lure coursing, the recognised Sighthounds are: Afghan Hound, Azawakh, Borzoi, Greyhound, Ibizan Hound, Irish Wolfhound, Pharaoh Hound, Saluki, Scottish Deerhound, Sloughi, Whippet and Italian Greyhound. Basenjis and Rhodesian Ridgebacks are also designated as Sighthounds for the purposes of lure coursing participation and titles. All other breeds and Associate register dogs fall into the Coursing Ability Test (CAT) stream.



Basic Rules:

A full detailed set of the rules and regulations can be found on the ANKC web site and covers the purpose of lure coursing, tests and trials, eligibility criteria, disqualifications, titles and awards, roles of the officials at a trial, how to run a meet, how the trial is judged and a glossary of terms.

Judges score dogs against five criteria: Enthusiasm – 15 points Follow – 15 points Speed – 25 points Agility – 25 points Endurance – 20 points

Total – 100 points



There may be 1, 2 or 3 judges. Where there is more than one judge on the field they stand apart and do not converse during the running of the course except to decide on matters such as re-runs. There is a Huntmaster who is in control of the proceedings on the field, the safety of the dogs, and gives the verbal release command of "Tally-Ho" to release the dogs for each course. The Lure Operator is responsible for operation of the machine that drives the lure around the course. And of course with any sporting event, you have the Gate Steward and Race Secretary on hand to round everyone up and give advice.

To begin, all dogs must gain a Junior Courser Qualification, which is a total of 300 points (150 at two meets gained in a four month period). This then allows a dog to compete for various titles depending on whether they are a Sighthound or non-Sighthound breed. Dogs run twice at each meet to gain their scores.

Dogs must be at least 18 months old to compete. The hard, fast turns are demanding on a dog's joints and lure coursing before this age can increase the risk of injury or cause joint problems later in life.

Future Trialing:

Next year, the NSW Lure Coursing Association will run some training days before the start of the trialing season to allow people with young dogs or potential trailers to get some experience chasing the lure. The lure will be straight course only, a shorter length course than a trialing course and there will be time to work with each dog to encourage it to chase.

Next year's NSW trialing season will offer 5 trials, with some in Sydney and others in regional NSW. The Association is also keen to assist interested breed clubs to hold lure coursing trials in conjunction with their shows.
